

Wagering Requirements Explained

Understanding **wagering requirements** (also called “playthrough” or “rollover”) is essential before claiming any casino bonus. This simple guide from **GamingFloor.com** explains what wagering means, why casinos use it, and how you can calculate your true withdrawal potential.

What Are Wagering Requirements?

Wagering requirements indicate how many times you must bet your bonus amount (and sometimes your deposit) before cashing out any winnings. Example: with a \$100 bonus and a 30× requirement, you must wager \$3,000 before withdrawal.

Why Casinos Use Wagering Rules

Casinos apply wagering to prevent instant withdrawals of bonus credits. It ensures players actively participate, giving the casino a fair chance to balance bonus costs with gameplay.

How to Calculate Wagering

Multiply your bonus (and deposit, if included) by the wagering multiplier. Simple examples:

- 1 • 30× bonus only: $\$100 \text{ bonus} \times 30 = \$3,000 \text{ total bets}$
- 2 • 40× deposit + bonus: $\$100 \text{ deposit} + \$100 \text{ bonus} = \$200 \times 40 = \$8,000 \text{ total bets}$

Tips to Clear Wagering Faster

- 1 Choose bonuses with lower wagering (20×–30×).
- 2 Play slots that count 100% toward wagering.
- 3 Avoid table games with lower contribution rates.
- 4 Track your progress via your casino account dashboard.

No Wagering Bonuses

Some casinos now offer “no wagering” or “wager-free” bonuses—meaning winnings from free spins or chips are immediately withdrawable. These offers suit players who prefer simple, transparent rewards.
